Celebrating the first year anniversary of SEPEN

The Joint Tender “Support for the health workforce planning and forecasting expert network” (SEPEN) is celebrating its first anniversary.

In our activities we aimed to initiate dialogues in health workforce (HWF) -related topics (e.g. skills development, creating planning models and projecting mobility flows etc.) with the wide audience and gain visibility to the essential area of HWF planning and policy. We managed to activate a health workforce planning and forecasting expert network that is still growing. More than 250 experts showed interest in our network underlining the importance of the core topic of our network.

Several experts met and connected from the HWF-related fields and had lively discussions at events, e.g. workshop on HWF skills and webinar on the network activities. SEPEN participated at several international and national level events (e.g. PROMIS: Health & Ageing sector investment, European funds and human resources: the post 2020 perspective in Rome, ESI Funds for Health Workforce Workshop in Sofia, Workforce innovations for better performing health system in Europe conference in Lisbon, EHMA 2018 Annual Conference in Budapest), where we had opportunity to exchange latest ideas and support each other in the development of HWF planning in different countries.

Experts seeking support identified some real-life problems (e.g. how to manage data collections for planning, which models to use in the projections, or how to implement policy interventions etc.) in workforce planning processes in their country and we are stepping onto the development paths together, and find the response to current

challenges.

To continue this fruitful collaboration, SEPEN carries out its further activities and organizes the next events in the online community and personal dialogues will also be enabled by the next workshops in HWF planning data and mobility data issues. We are looking forward to welcoming you and your expertise and experiences in SEPEN.

Health Workforce Planning and Forecasting Expert Network

The online community on the EU Health Policy Platform of SEPEN was activated and the first webinar was organized to launch the platform and present the opportunities of the platform use. The second webinar on the EU Health Policy Platform was held on the 26th September.

The title of the webinar was "Fostering development of national/regional health workforce planning". The webinar focused on the tailored advice and consultation in health workforce planning that SEPEN Joint Tender is offering to EU Member States. Detailed discussion presented the opportunity of receiving tailored guidance from the SEPEN network.

Mapping HWF policies in EU 28

SEPEN team has started the desk research and data collection on HWF policies in the EU28. We do count on the contribution of national level experts in the field of HWF planning and HWF-related policies in terms of the latest information and developments. As an output of this mapping activity we will produce a collection of country information sheets.

Workshop update

On 6 and 7 February 2018, a workshop on 'Planning for health professions: how to act on skills needs' took place in Brussels, organised by the SEPEN tender. As the first of a series of five workshops, it was dedicated to the topic of health workforce planning for health professionals' skills. It was intended that workshop participants have the opportunity to reflect on the health workforce challenges they currently face, exchange good practices and improve their capacities on health workforce planning.

The second workshop of SEPEN tender will be organized in Budapest in October. This event will focus on exploring key HWF planning data in relation to the Minimum planning data requirements elaborated in the Joint Action on European HWF planning and forecasting programme and the WHO National Health Workforce Accounts.

Interactive group discussions aim to share experiences of experts on the field and reveal the existing challenges in different EU Member States.

Forecasting The Hospital of the Future

The Hospital of the Future

Hospitals are complex organizations that require different approaches to management. A new hospital is built to work for more than 50 years, therefore forecasting is crucial for better planning. In today's hospitals, evidence-based knowledge translation still fails to reach managers. In recent years, the development of clinical research in the academic hospitals led to the establishment of the "evidence-based medicine", whereas management is still considered as a "less important" element of the organization. Modelling is an extraordinary tool to support decision-making in complex environments, moreover when facing significant uncertainties.

The aim of our research has been to establish a pioneering project in forecasting the new hospital of Lisbon, which is planned to open in 2023 and it should work at least until 2070. The Lisbon hospital of the future forecast (Hospital.Lis) exercise will serve as an evidence-based knowledge broker to hospital managers in assisting them on planning the new hospital, in an expected participative-research approach.
